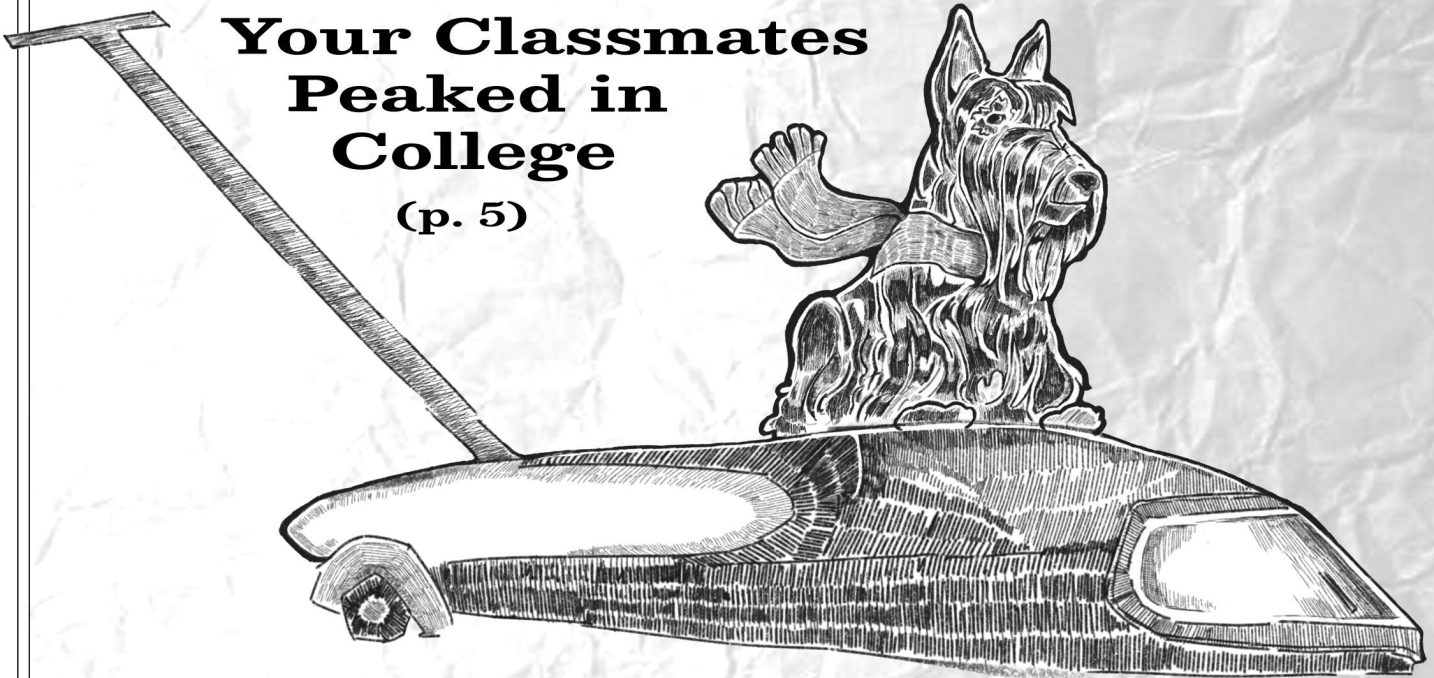

## Spring Carnival Committee found dead in office

The CMU community is in shock after the discovery on Wednesday morning that all of Spring Carnival Committee (SCC) has died. ## Booth Stuns CMU With Structural Anomaly

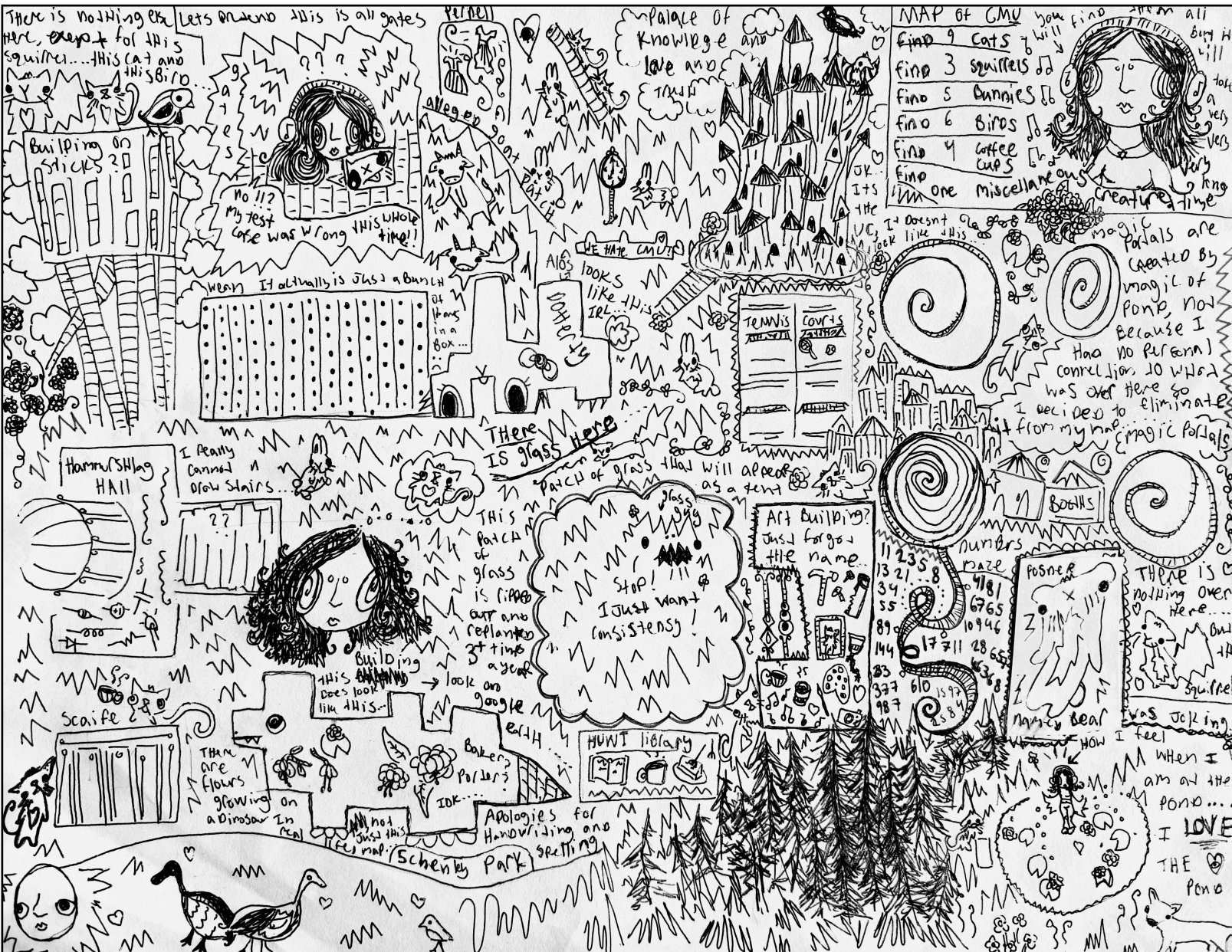
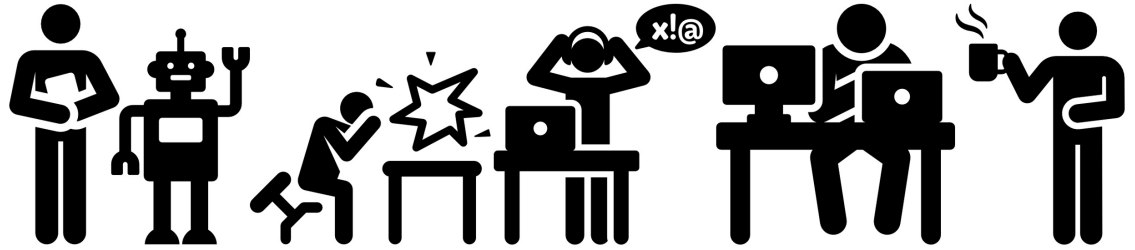

# NYC Renter SHOCKED by Spacious Booths

Wednesday. 2:00 PM. Pittsburgh.  
It was supposed to be a fun weekend getaway, but for 28-year-old Manhattan barista and renter John Novak, even a glimpse into the festive booths at Carnival turned into an existential crisis on the state of real estate.
